- c. Consensus-oriented (Consensus Oriented) - Mediating various interests to fulfill broad consensus in accordance with the best interests of the entire community.
- d. Equality and Inclusiveness - Everyone must have the opportunity to improve or maintain their well-being.
- e. Effectiveness and Efficiency (Effectiveness and Efficiency) - Every existing process and institution must be able to produce something that meets the needs of the community while making the best use of available resources.
- f. Accountability - Government agencies, the private sector, and community organizations must be held accountable to the public and institutional stakeholders.
- g. Transparency - Information must be accessible to the public and can be understood and monitored.
- h. Responsiveness - Every existing process and institution must serve all stakeholders.

DISCUSSION

Governance in Indonesia

In the beginning, governance in Indonesia was in the form of centralization, in which the Central Government held full management of all regions in the region, which caused many problems in remote areas because many people thought that with centralized centralization development was only at the center and without involving the community. 1998 was the beginning of decentralization or in other words regional autonomy, where each region had the authority and the right to manage their respective regions. Therefore, the reform era was the beginning of the beginning of clean and dignified governance.
